

Purple for Parents United Exposes Dark Money Ties; Expands to Texas as Call for IEDC Audit Gains Momentum

Purple for Parents United, a leading grassroots organization advocating for transparency, parental rights, and educational integrity, continues to expose the dark money networks infiltrating state institutions. Under the leadership of CEO Rhonda Miller and President Jon Schrock, the organization is seeing growing support across Indiana and beyond.

Rhonda Miller and Jon Schrock have consistently called for a full audit of the Indiana Economic Development Corporation (IEDC) and the Indiana Economic Development Foundation (IEDF), citing growing evidence of entanglement with globalist foundations and untraceable financial influence. Their persistent advocacy is resonating with Hoosiers and legislators alike, as conversations around accountability and transparency in economic development intensify.

Jon Schrock has personally held in-depth meetings in 41 Indiana counties, engaging directly with families, educators, and local leaders. These meetings-known as the 'Farmland Conferences'-are now celebrating their third anniversary. What began as small gatherings in rural communities has grown into a powerful movement of citizens demanding truth and transparency in state affairs.

"After traveling through over 41 counties in Indiana, it's clear that families are waking up to what's

happening behind the scenes," said CEO Rhonda Miller. "People are beginning to connect the

dots-from the Urban Institute to other elite-backed entities funneling money into our education and

public policy systems without oversight."

As part of its expanding mission, Purple for Parents United is now launching a chapter in Texas,

where Miller is meeting with state leaders, grassroots organizations, and concerned citizens. The

focus is to shine a light on what the organization calls a "coordinated global dark money conspiracy"

seeping into U.S. institutions under the guise of progress and reform.

"We're uncovering how these agendas are funded, who's behind them, and how they're undermining

parental authority and community values," added Schrock. "This isn't just about Indiana

anymore-this is a national issue, and the response in Texas is proving that."

Purple for Parents United pledges to continue its mission of informing communities, holding

institutions accountable, and protecting the rights of families through grassroots education and direct

action.
